Day Camp Procedures

Thanks for joining us at Day Camp this summer. We are thankful for the opportunity to be a blessing in your child's life. Our staff is working hard to give your child a great experience at this year's camp. We believe that they will be blessed and encouraged during the week.

It has been a challenging year for all of us, but we believe that camp is a special place where God speaks through His Word to campers and encourages them. A camp experience will be a great opportunity for your child. We have a western theme planned.

Camp will operate a little differently this summer so that we can make it as safe as possible. We are going to have safety protocols in place, but we are attempting to do them in a way that your child will not notice that we are doing things differently. With that in mind, here is what you and your child can expect this year.

To expedite check-in, we ask that camper's bill be paid in full before the start of camp, if possible. Your bill can be paid through your online account, by calling our office at 570-278-1001 or by mailing the balance to us at Montrose Bible Conference, 218 Locust Street, Montrose, PA 18801. If you are unable to pay in advance, please place your balance due in a sealed envelope with your camper's name on it and hand it to us during the check-in process.

Our snack shop will be open daily for snacks and camp store items. You may provide money to be put onto the camper's store account when you pay your registration balance. Any unused balance will be refunded to you after camp concludes.

Please complete our camp health form before the start of camp. This form is located on the online registration portal. Call us if you have any questions.

There is a discount for Day Camp if your child comes to both the July & August Day Camps.

Before you leave home:

Take your child's temperature and evaluate their general health. If they show a temperature of 100.4 or greater or COVID-19 symptoms, please have them remain at home for evaluation for 72 hours. If you or your camper are sick or have recently had close contact with a person with COVID-19, please remain home. Refunds can be issued if you are unable to attend camp.

Please complete our pre-camp screening & waiver form and bring it with you to registration. If you have questions about the form, please call us. It is available on our website.

What to Bring: (REMEMBER TO LABEL ALL PERSONAL ITEMS!)

Campers should bring any personal items in a backpack. Backpacks may be carried with campers throughout the day or be stored in a designated location. Campers are encouraged to bring a water bottle with them.

Modest Bathing Suit, Flip Flops or Water Shoes, and Towel.

Plastic Bag to store wet items

A Jacket or Sweatshirt for chilly mornings

Sunscreen and a Hat for sun protection

Bible, Notebook and Pen

Rain gear if needed

Sneakers

Please feel free to dress in western attire if you have it

Camper Drop Off: 8:30 am to 9 am

For check-in, we are asking that everyone remain in their cars. Our staff will greet you and the camper's temperatures will be checked before getting out of the car. Anyone with a temperature of 100.4 or greater will be sent home. If someone in your car has a fever of 100.4 or greater the other campers in your car must return home also. After the screening has taken place, we will ask the camper to get out of the car, and we will have them join their age-appropriate group. We ask that no one else gets out of the car. If you will be arriving after 9 am, please call us at 570-278-1001 to coordinate the drop off with our staff.

Camper Medications – If your camper will need medication during their camp day, please place medications in their ORIGINAL container with doctor's instructions in a Ziploc bag and provide it during check-in. If you have any additional instructions, please put them in writing and include in the Ziploc bag.

Camper Pick Up: 4:30 pm to 5 pm

Please remain in your car. Staff will meet you and have your camper brought to you.

Safety Practices

As per the PA Department of Health guidelines, campers will NOT be required to wear masks. Staff will wear masks where feasible.

There will be an emphasis on outdoor activities, and we will be using our pool and lakefront.

Lunch will be served to campers in individual portions.

If a camper gets sick during the day and has a temperature of 100.4 or greater, the camper will be placed in an isolated room from others and carefully monitored until they can be picked up.

Campers will be encouraged to wash their hands frequently or to use hand sanitizer throughout the day.

We will intensify our cleaning protocols, disinfection, and ventilation of facilities.

We will train our employees on health and safety protocols. Employees will have their temperature checked at the beginning of each day and will stay home if they are ill.

We are continuing to monitor the latest guidelines from the CDC and the PA Department of Health.
